*CAVEAT: The following list of Images of John Muir which we believe to be in the public domain is based on research, but given the complex nature of U.S. copyright law, and sometimes strident objections by persons seeking to make a profit, our opinion cannot be considered definitive. In all cases, it is the researcher's obligation to determine and satisfy copyright or other use restrictions when publishing or otherwise distributing materials found in any source.*

This illustrated list of images is intended to identify frequently requested photographs or images of John Muir that are in the public domain in the United States. Also included are some materials which are not in the public domain, but for which a license or liberal permission re-use policies can be easily obtained, as noted.

Public domain status applies to U.S. works where the copyright has expired, often because its first publication occurred prior to a certain date (which as of this writing is January 1, 1927, a date which advances one year every year), or was published from 1927 through 1963 with copyright notice but copyright was not renewed.

Creating works from public domain print editions, such as the original source represented by these photographs, means that no one owns a United States copyright in these works, so anyone may copy and distribute it in the United States without permission and without paying copyright royalties.

His first explorations were in the less known regions of North America. For 25 years he wandered from the Gulf of Mexico to the glaciers of Alaska. In 1879 he discovered the famous Alaska glacier which bears his name. He was a member of the relief expedition sent to the Arctic regions on the United States steamer "Corwin." He wrote over 150 articles on the physiography and natural history of the Pacific coast, on Alaska, etc. He was one of the pioneers of the movement to conserve forests and establish natural parks. He was a member of the American Academy of Art and Letters. His most important works were: "Mountains of California" (1894); "Our National Parks" (1901); "Story of My Boyhood and Youth" (1913). He also contributed much to periodicals. 

Page 80 includes the following brief biography:</p> <p>John Muir ( 1838-1914), geologist and explorer, was born in Dunbar, and came with his parents to the United States when eleven years old and settled on a farm in Wisconsin. In 1860 he entered the University of Wisconsin, supporting himself by teaching, and by working in the harvest fields. After an accident to one of his eyes, in 1867, he set out on foot for California, with a few books and a plant press. His wanderings led him into the Sierras and through the Yosemite Valley, the later preservation of which, together with the Big Trees and other National Parks, the United States owes almost solely to him. As a member of the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey, he explored thousands of miles of Alaska, whose greatest glacier is named for him. He also traveled extensively in Norway, Switzerland and Brazil. 
